Table A.2 shows that the distribution of Jamaica's population is skewed and the majority of people live in the urban cities of Kingston and St. Andrew (25%) and St Catherine (19%). The Jamaican Diaspora is an increasingly important part of Jamaica's 'population' which must be factored into discussions on gender, the EPA trade and the country's development. In recent years, the Jamaican Diaspora which also includes a large group of Jamaicans living in the United Kingdom has become more organized. June 16 is commemorated as Jamaican Diaspora Day and in June 2007, the group held its regional conference which focused on entrepreneurship, immigration, education and culture as well as youth. The Jamaican Diaspora Trade Council also held an investment seminar and trade exposition at the conference which targeted potential investors and highlighted development initiatives in Information, Communication and Technology (ICT), Agro- Allied Industry, Health and Wellness Tourism among other areas. This initiative emerged from the 2004 Diaspora Conference mandate to promote trade and investment opportunities in Jamaica (see ESSJ 20.13).

Table A.3 shows that population growth has remained low, consistently below 1.0 percent since 1998. The General Fertility Rate for women 15- 49 years is 61.9 births per 1,000 women. The country is the recipient of a GOJ/EU/UNFPA Joint Programme on Sexual and Reproductive Health which is part of a larger EU/ACP project and has had a significant impact in supporting poverty reduction, by supporting universal access to integrate gender-sensitive and rights based sexual and reproductive health services. In 2007, the Crude Death Rate increased by 4.3 per cent relative to 2007 but has remained fairly consistent in relation to the country National Population Policy. The major causes of mortality according to the ESSJ 2007 were due to lifestyle diseases, traffic accidents, homicides, and AIDS. A gender profile of these causes point to high rates of obesity in women, high rates of deaths among men due to traffic accidents and homicides. The feminization of HIV and AIDS is a growing concern given the high rates of female headed households. International migration is an emerging issue which impacts on family life, the labour market, remittances as well as the structure and growth of the population (ESSJ 2007: 20.4). While the majority of Jamaicans migrate to the USA (26,628 in 2007), smaller numbers migrate to the United Kingdom (an estimated 534 in 2007 and 530 in 2006). ESSJ data for 2006 shows that the largest category in this group was husbands (49%) followed by wives (20%) and children under 18 years (17%). The trend of return migration is increasing. While the majority of Jamaicans returning to reside are from the USA, some are also from the UK (16%). Deportees from the UK decreased between 940 in 2006 to 870 in 2007.
